Accessibility and Parking for Dragon Boat Rowers

The general area of Salford Quays and the launch area for the boats is very accessible for wheelchair users. There are a number of benches located along the quayside where people who might have difficulty in walking can stop and take a rest.

Parking at the rear of the Water Sport Centre is very limited and some bays will be allocated for the use of Dragon Boat rowers who display official blue (disabled driver) badges. These spaces are available on a first come first served basis and must be reserved in advance, please see below for contact details. However, further spaces are also available at the nearby Lowry Outlet Mall without the need for reservation, though management of these spaces is beyond control of the event organisers.
